UCAIR Hosts Gas Can Exchange to Help Improve Air Quality

In Partnership with Chevron, Rio Tinto Kennecott, and Davis Technical College

Kaysville, Utah — UCAIR (Utah Clean Air Partnership) invites the community to make a big impact at its Gas Can Exchange event on Saturday, May 31. Utahns can bring in their old, empty gas cans and exchange them for a free, EPA-approved gas can, while supplies last.

“Even everyday items like gas cans can affect our air quality,” said Lindsie Smith, Executive Director of UCAIR. “By making this simple switch, Utahns can help improve air quality by reducing VOC emissions, which also helps protect their family's health as they are reducing exposure in their homes.”

The event aims to reduce volatile organic compound (VOC) emissions, a major contributor to the formation of ground-level ozone, especially during Utah’s hot summer months. Traditional gas cans can leak harmful fumes into the air. Newer, EPA-compliant cans are spill-proof and significantly reduce air pollution.

Utah State Representative Paul Cutler, an advocate for practical clean air solutions, emphasized the importance of community participation. “Everybody in Utah appreciates clean air. This event makes it easy for those of us in Davis County to do something to help improve our air quality by trading in that old leaky gas can in the garage for a new environmentally friendly clean gas can.”
